Lee Deter's O Gauge Layout - November's Layout Tour

ee Deter invited members to tour his layout on November 4th. Lee's home is located in the Pocket area of South Sacramento.

The layout is still under construction and is a 12' x 15' Lionel O-gauge layout. It is very well constructed with neat benchwork. The track plan is well developed and consists of two levels. The approaches to the upper level are semiconcealed and not so obvious as many upper level approaches are. It goes around the outside of three sides of the layout similar to the first level of a helix.

The layout occupies a spare bedroom and is tucked against two walls with a center access. There is a lift bridge gate with a truss bridge to provide access to the center of the layout.

This was another in our "layout visit"








"Carryphone" Aids Trainmen

Engineers and trainmen can keep in constant touch with their own crews or talk with the crews of other trains with the "Carryphone", a portable telephone announced by the Pennsylvania Railroad. The device uses railroad tracks or wires as its communication channels, but transmits and receives messages through the air by induction, using a large metal loop.

Pete's layout fills the room around him








Jack Hornor grins at one of Jack Ahearn's many jokes


though in his precise wiring, wireless remote control, and in the operating Lionel nuclear reactor featured in one area of the layout.

Jack and George Ann designed their lay-




Jack at "mission control". Neatness and attention to detail abound
