The big news is that National's liability insurance covers members and registered guests at our regular monthly meetings (at our regular site). If we host a paid -attendance (i.e., public) event we must get a special rider through National for \$100 per day. All they need is a 30 day minimum notice and HQ will arrange for the

rider. Good deal! (Note that registered guests are covered, that's why we have instituted a stricter badge policy at SVD meets. No badge – no coverage for us!)

The 2009 National meet is all set for Chicago. The 2010 National set for Vancouver Canada has been moved to San Antonio Texas (too many problems with import duties and new passport requirements for attendees). Membership continues to drop but at a slower rate than in the recent past. We all need to encourage people to join at every train event! We have a fresh supply of new SVD flyers (thanks to **Barbara Rohrs**) so pick up a few and keep them handy for your next show or hobby shop visit. National is working hard to streamline the office operations. The new quarterly renewal scheme and the new card printer are both in place (at last!). Randy Giroux has been criticized by some Divisions for the decisions made and failures encountered. He is really dedicated to helping the Club and has the skills and knowledge to make it work but Microsoft bugs can undo the best efforts! HOME LAYOUT TOURS

Dean Busick Layout Tour - March 7

Wow! What a layout – a vintage Lionel D-291 Dealer Layout integrated into a 16' x 17' modern layout with all the bells and whistles – in other words, the best of the postwar and modern worlds. The system is powered by two MTH Z-4000's and several smaller trans-



formers. The new Lionel Legacy system controls his TMCC-equipped locomotives and accessories. To control conventional locomotives, Dean uses his remote that came with the Z-4000's -



quite a system, and again the best of two worlds. Postwar trains run on the dealer layout while modern trains use the Ross track and switches on the modern layout, to which by the way, Dean has added the new Ross transfer table since our last visit. The day of our visit, Dean was run-

ning a Lionel Premium Scale (although three-rail) NYC 20th Century streamliner with a Dreyfus Hudson and a lash-up of two powered diesels pulling a Santa Fe passenger train.

The artistic touch of the kit-built structures and the dynamic lighting, thanks to Dean's background as a lighting engineer, make this a unique layout to visit. In his night scenes, he can create moonlight from any direction or no moon at all – only train and building lights.



Dean and his sister, **Diane Crabb**, were marvelous hosts, with a lunch of sandwiches and desserts. Even the dog, **Millie**, was friendly and added to a pleasant afternoon under his great lemon tree. Thank you, Dean.

One of the most visited and commented upon layouts at the TCA Scottish Rite Show was **Dave Thomsen's** Military Theme Layout. It was a fitting and appropriate Memorial Day exhibit.

Dave is known for his creative and colorfully imaginative small layouts. However, for this G.I. themed pike, instead of bright colors and animated accessories, this one had lots of only one color....Olive Drab, Olive Drab and,....more Olive Drab!

Two complete military trains, including the engines, were painted in that Army "tint". Dave also carefully and artistically applied appropriate decals to all freight cars, engines, jeeps, tanks, "deuce and a halfs" and the many other pieces displayed.

One piece stood out, not only because of its lighter prototype color, but for the modeling excellence that went into its construction. Dave had seen an odd piece of equipment on the Military Channel. It was, yes, a tank, but one with no cannon. Instead, it was converted for construction use with a long boom and hook replacing the cannon barrel.

That did it for Dave. Both his imagination and creativity cells lit up fully charged. Piece by piece he gathered the necessary parts, and scratch-built the critical part which made this

model tank/crane unique; the elongated boom and hook. Applying the correct paint color and proper decals, he built a Blue Ribbon class scale model!

TREASURER'S REPORT



I have received all payments for the renewing club member dues to date. I hope all of the outstanding people who have not renewed their membership rejoin our club. I have renewed both of our club Certificates of Deposit (CDs) at Bank of America. The first CD was renewed in March at a rate of 2.5%, redeemable with no penalty anytime a better rate is available. The second CD was renewed in May at a rate of 2%, which is better than the default renewal rate of 1% on it and 1.25% for the first CD. The interest on these CDs subsidizes the cost for the Sierra 2 meeting location and the layout costs which dues do not fully cover. I wish I could have negotiated higher rates on these, but that was the best they were offering at the time.

Remember, we have a raffle at our Sierra 2 Club meets of a highly desirable, limited quantity Lionel or American Flyer car from past offerings. Come and see me at the reception desk for tickets for these cars. The tickets are 1 ticket for \$1.00 or 7 tickets for \$5.00. Winner has a choice of either car. In the July 2009 issue of Classic Toy Trains magazine, there is a feature on our Club Car on Page 24. I will have this car for sale at the entrance desk, too. The car sells for \$50.00 plus Ca. sales tax.

The club received a \$25 stipend for operating our layout at the May Sac-Sierra TCA meet.


